(Our Grandmother)

This annual scholarship was established to assist one Penobscot tribal member pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited, non-profit institution. This includes undergraduate as well as graduate programs. One award of \$2000.00 will be granted for the Spring 2018 semester and paid directly to the College or University. Awards are based on financial need for un-met tuition expenses only. Awards will not be based on academic achievement/ grades.

Eligibility:

- 1. Must be an enrolled Penobscot Nation tribal member
- 2. Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- 3. Must be accepted into a post-secondary, non-profit institution and enrolled for a minimum of 9 credit hours
- 4. Must have an un-met financial need for tuition expenses

- 1. Complete the scholarship application, including essay, acceptance letter and FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR).
